Memorial Day Facts

- ★ Started on May 30, 1868
- ★ Union General John A. Logan declared the day an occasion to decorate the graves of Civil War soldiers
- ★ Twenty years later, the name was changed to Memorial Day
- ★ President Richard M. Nixon declared Memorial Day a federal holiday in 1971



Ascension of the Lord

ASCENSION: the act of rising to a higher level

The Ascension of the Lord takes place forty days after the resurrection of Jesus (Easter).

Technically, this day falls on a Thursday, but the celebration is transferred to the following Sunday. On this day, Jesus was taken up to Heaven in his resurrected body in the presence of his apostles.

BIBLICAL REFERENCES

● While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. Luke 24:51

● So then the Lord Jesus, since he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God. Mark 16:19

● As the apostles were watching, Jesus was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? The Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." Acts 1:9-11

Jesus departs, he ascends to Heaven. He returns to the Father. But this does not mean a resignation, for he remains forever with us, in a new way. By his ascension, the Blessed Lord draws the gaze of the Apostles - and our gaze - to the heights of Heaven to show us that the end of our journey is the Father. The Lord's ascension is the most dramatic of the events in the life of Jesus. He is there! He accompanies us, he guides us, he holds us by the hand and he lifts us up when we fall down.
